The Pronovost family dominated the three steps of the podium in the Mod-Lite 1000, Dean won the first title in front of his two sons Christian and Patrick. Dean was also the rookie. In the 600, Dave Bell was the winner in front of Wyatt Mullin and Pat Bell, son of Dave. Dave Bell also won the rookie title.

Martin Bernard was the champion in the 4-cylinder category in front of Martin Lagacé and Jean-Marc Larose.

The president cup was given to Dean Pronovost for his devotion in the sport and also the creation of the Mod-Lite category.
