



Edelweiss Speedway will present his biggest show of the season this Friday!

Cantley, PQ – Monday, July 27, 2009 – Martin Bélanger – Edelweiss Speedway will host his biggest show of the 2009 season as the Lucas Oil Canadian DIRT Challenge will make a stop at the speedway for their annual trip. The Mod-Lite will also have a special event counting for TUSA Regional points and the 4-cylinder class will complete the night.

The best modified drivers of Quebec, Ontario and Northern United-States will be at the speedway to compete for a total of over \$20,000 in prize money with the winner getting a cool \$3,000 for his win. More than 30 cars are expected to be in the pits for this great event. Invaders such as David Hébert, Mario Clair, Kayle Robidoux, Yan Bussière will be here to compete against local top runners such as Pierre Dagenais, Eric and Denis Gauvreau, Peter Mantha and young guns Gage Morin and Bobby Herrington. Last year 40 cars had signed in the pits to race as Mario Clair had won the feature after a great battle with Clément Therrien and Kayle Robidoux in the final laps of the feature.

Also on the program a special invitational 25-lap feature race for the Mod-Lite category has the Mod Lite NYDCA Club which includes confirmed participants of 13 to 15 drivers, including current top runners Shawn Sliter, Jamie Gilbert and 2008 TUSA Canadian Regional Champion Paul Klager who had won a feature in his only visit at the speedway last year. A few ESDCA members from the Syracuse, NY area are also attending this event bringing the total car count to approximately 23 cars; including local drivers.

Paul Klager and Dean Pronovost have been working hard promoting the event and the entire group of travelers is very excited to put on a show to remember, for the Edelweiss fans. The next day the group is travelling to Brockville Speedway for another night of action packed three wide racing.

The 4-cylinder will also be in action for a regular 12-lap feature, many newcomers have joined the group in the last few weeks. General admission will be 20\$ for adults, 16\$ for students and seniors, kids 12 years and under will get in for free. Pit admission will be 30\$. We suggest that you arrive early as time trials will start at 6:30pm and the first heat is scheduled to start at 7:30pm. Do not miss the best show of the season, as you will be able to see several new cars on the track. Be there!
